Learn more about LDD

Lymantria dispar dispar (LDD) is a species of moth. In the winter their egg masses can be easily seen on tree trunks. If not removed the eggs will hatch in the spring and larvae will ascend the trees to feed on the foliage. To help stop the spread, egg masses can be scraped off with a dull knife and dropped into a bucket filled with soapy water for up to two days. Always wear gloves when removing the egg masses or caterpillars as they may cause skin irritation or a rash.
