If you see someone who may be in need of shelter, residents and municipal staff may call the **Street Outreach Van** between 2 p.m. and 9 p.m. at 1-866-553-4053. The **Street Outreach Van** provides clothing, food, sleeping bags and tents to homeless people in York Region, and will refer individuals to seasonal shelters.

- CHATS Meals on Wheels Program offers more than 100 tasty and nutritious soups, entrees, breakfasts, and desserts.
 All products arrive frozen at your door and are ready for you to store in your home freezer. During COVID-19 CHATS is offering contactless delivery for this service:
 - All dishes have been created in line with the recommendations of Canada's Food Guide with controlled levels of fat and sodium. This means that you can be sure that they are healthy as well as delicious.
 - There is a fee associated with this service however, some individuals may be eligible for subsidy.
- CHATS Grocery Shopping Program for seniors without supports will provide the following:
 - 1. Transportation to and from your local grocery store
 - 2. You order and CHATS picks up and provides contact free delivery
 - 3. Online ordering for groceries and contact free delivery via our personal support desk

Vaccines

COVID-19 vaccines are now available in York Region, and are being administered in priority order to ensure that our most vulnerable and high-risk populations receive the vaccine first. Vaccine distribution is taking place in phases. As more supplies become available, vaccines will be offered to everyone who wants one, in the priority order outlined by Ontario's COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution Task Force.

COVID-19 vaccines are an important tool in helping stop the spread of the virus and will allow individuals and families to safely return to a normal life. Immunization is one of the safest ways to protect you and your family from illness associated with vaccine preventable diseases. Vaccines being developed are used to prevent COVID-19, which is caused by the SARS-COV-2 virus.
