This is accomplished through specialized programming, individualized support options and accessible facilities for patrons with disabilities or unique needs. Service animals are welcome at all Town owned and operated facilities.

Additional Support

Participants with disabilities and unique needs are encouraged to take part in year-round recreation programs that suit their interests and hobbies. If assistance is required outside of the typical staff to participant ratio, individuals have the following options:

• 1:1 Town Support Staff

Inclusion 1:1 support staff are available to facilitate participation in all Town of Aurora recreation programs. A support staff may provide redirection for safety reasons and allow opportunities for sensory or emotional breaks. If your participant requires 1:1 support, please register in the corresponding day of 1:1 Support for this season's Registered Programs & Workshops code. Note: Space is limited.

• External Support Workers

The Town of Aurora welcomes external personal support workers, with a valid Police Vulnerable Sectors Check, into all our programs and drop-ins at no additional registration costs. An external support worker can include a parent, family member, or paid external staff member at the expense of the family.

INCLUSION SUPPORT

If you have any questions about registering for 1:1 Support, please email our Inclusion Services Team at inclusion@aurora.ca.

Participants require additional support if:

- They have extra support at school or at home;
- A physical, medical, or developmental/learning disability exists that affects the safety of others;
- Extra support is required at home for basic care such as dressing and toileting;
- The individual is currently associated with a support agency or program; or
- There are challenging behaviours to be managed.

1:1 Support for Seasonal Programs

Age: 4 to 12 years

Inclusion 1:1 Support is available for participants with disabilities whose needs are not met within large group supervision ratios and require an additional staff to be integrated into the program. Inclusion 1:1 Support staff can provide emotional and sensory breaks, assist with personal care, and help adapt programming to fit the needs of each individual participant. Inclusion 1:1 Support is NOT a program; it is a support service. Registrants must register into a seasonal Registered Program or Workshop, in addition to the corresponding day of the 1:1 support. This 1:1 Support Service is only available to Aurora Residents.

SOAR MINDFUL TRANSITIONS PROGRAM

Age: 16 to 21 years

The SOAR Mindful Transitions Program supports youth ages 16 to 21 years old with learning disabilities and ADHD as they transition out of high school into their chosen pathways, whether post-secondary education or employment. It builds skills in self-advocacy, executive functioning, organization, stress management, understanding their diagnosis, and accessing accommodations to support confidence and independence.

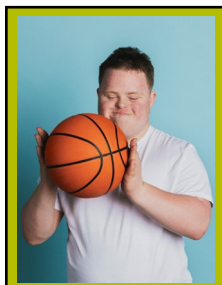
